Pentatonic Rubbernecking is an exhibition by Jacob van Schalkwyk and Michael MacGarry. The title alludes to an artistic practice that combines the ethical dilemma of what Arthur Jaffa calls 'rubbernecking' with Kofi Agawu's understanding of pre-colonial African music(s) as isolated from the catastrophic influences of tonal harmony on non-Western (pentatonic) forms of musical expression.²

Van Schalkwyk and MacGarry have previously combined efforts on several of MacGarry's early short films; *LHR-JNB* (2010), *Will to Power* (2010) and *As Above, So Below.* (2016). *Pentatonic Rubbernecking* is their first exhibition together, the by-product of a decade-long conversation about making art.

BIOGRAPHIES

Visual artist and writer Jacob van Schalkwyk's practice raises questions about the received wisdoms of (Western) art history and the the nature of form. After nine years in New York City – where he obtained a BFA in Drawing from the Pratt Institute (2003) – he exhibited with GALLERY AOP in Johannesburg until 2014 and more recently with David Krut Projects in Johannesburg, Cape Town and New York. His debut novel, The Alibi Club, was published by Umuzi/Random House in 2014. He teaches drawing and painting at Stellenbosch University, where he completed his MAVA in Sculpture (2018).

Michael MacGarry is a visual artist from Johannesburg, he holds an MFA (WITS, 2004). Exhibitions include TATE Modern, Guggenheim Bilbao, Zeitz MOCAA and Rencontres de Bamako. Film festivals include Oberhausen (IKO), Rotterdam (IFFR) and Festival de Clermont-Ferrand. MacGarry's multidisciplinary practice is focused on socio-political narratives drawn through a post-humanist autobiographical mode.










